Letter of Objection to proposed "No parking" Yellow lines outside our driveway (No 11 Manor Road Felixstowe)

Having looked closely at the plans for the proposed yellow lines in Manor Road-Terrace (No 11 side of the road) I feel that it really wouldn't be necessary to have these lines right in front of our driveway in order to keep the corner of Manor Road/Terrace clear of congestion.

To put yellow lines right across our drive would cause us many problems as we need access to that drive throughout the day and often our van is parked on it or in front of it for loading purposes.

If you look closely we at no 11 are actually positioned quite a way clear of that corner and even if the yellow lines began from our boundary fence running in the sea direction there would still be more than enough room for any vehicle to turn on that corner.

Would it please be possible to look again at the possibility of starting the lines from our boundary fence instead of right across our drop kerb.?

I understand your concern maybe could be that others may park in front of our drive if you don't put yellow lines across it but we haven't had any problems with this happening in all the years we have been here and I can't really see it becoming a problem now.

Please could you advise me of any decisions being made regarding this situation?

In any case, my original comments still stand regardless of the length of the restriction, namely that the restriction is un-necessary as the flow of traffic is not currently restricted along this stretch of road, and that the only effect will be inconvenience to the residents of Manor Terrace who will lose parking space in an area where parking is already short.

Dear Mr Stenning,

The purpose of the proposed waiting restriction opposite nos. 12 to 17 is to provide a passing place during the daytime in the most congested section of the road. The passing place will aid the flow of two way traffic in the area, which is important as Manor Terrace provides the only route for visitors to the Nature Reserve car park. In addition, the route is also used by some holiday makers with their holiday homes.

The number of residents' vehicles parked on the road is unlikely to decrease and the expected effect of the proposed restriction will be to displace some of those vehicles. Therefore, on-road parking in the area will continue to serve in calming traffic speeds and will in fact extend over a slightly wider area.

I realise that the new waiting restriction is a very sensitive issue for residents and your formal objection highlights this. The 25m length of restriction reflects the ideal size passing place that we would like to introduce. However, I have discussed the basis of your objection with my line manager in an effort to resolve the matter, without the need for taking it to the Rights of Way Committee. After a great deal of consideration, we are prepared to reduce the length of the waiting restriction to 18m, which should be sufficient for three cars to pull in.

Please let me know if you consider this to be a reasonable compromise. Obviously, if you do not find this acceptable, the matter will need to be considered at the Rights of Way Committee where a final decision will be made.

I look forward to your response.

Thank you for your message.

Your concerns about the proposed parking restrictions in Manor Terrace have been noted. Unless these are resolved by the Highway Network Improvement team, who instructed Legal Services to do the associated legal work, your comments will in due course be included in any report that is made to the Rights of Way Committee. This Committee considers both rights of way and traffic management proposals that are contested.

The Committee's recommendations are then reported to the Portfolio Holder, Councillor Guy McGregor, for a final decision on the proposals and in that case I will write to you again after the decision. In the meantime I will refer your correspondence to the scheme manager for her attention.

The dates of the next two meetings of the Rights of Way Committee at which these proposals may be considered are 8 September and 1 November 2011. Further to the correspondence from the Highway Network Improvement Services department and the proposal posted by your department in Manor Terrace recently, we are writing to register our strong objection to the proposed parking restriction opposite no. 12 to no. 17 Manor Terrace, Felixstowe.

The houses along this short stretch of Manor Terrace are narrow, and the few that have off road parking have very limited access. It is therefore a daily occurrence for both sides of the road to be fully used for the parking of residents vehicles and any removal of parking along this part of the road will both anger the residents and have the effect of spreading the parking along the road towards Languard Nature Reserve. We are not aware of any problems caused by the current parking arrangements, and if anything it serves to calm the traffic in the inhabited stretch of the road. Furthermore, Manor Terrace serves as access to only the residents, the caravan parks and the Nature Reserve, and traffic could only be described as light at the busiest times of the year.

If the council were to propose measures to address the concerns of the local residents we are sure the response would be more favourable. In the last year a pet dog was hit by a speeding car outside no. 19 Manor Terrace and there have been several near misses involving cars travelling at far in excess of the speed limit. These concerns were raised during the local consultation at the beginning of the year and we thought that the residents had been listened to when an amended parking restriction proposal was published, but we are disappointed to see that the council has decided to make a U turn, presumably on the advice of someone who has never talked to the residents or possibly even visited the road in question.



Proposed changes to parking, Manor Terrace, Felixstowe.

I am writing in support of the proposed parking changes for Manor Road and Manor Terrace Felixstowe.

I have campaigned for some permanent parking restrictions in Manor Road and Manor Terrace over the last few years because at busy times when a flow of traffic forms into or out of Manor End it can become impossible to travel in the opposite direction against that flow. At the first consultation meeting I gave my view that the small passing areas proposed in Manor Road and Manor Terrace were the bare minimum required and larger passing areas really needed to be installed to alleviate this problem.

I understand that some residents have complained of insufficient parking on street. All the houses in Manor Terrace have access to the rear of their properties were they can park and there is also plenty of off street parking on the vacant site opposite the properties so to quibble over the loss of a few spaces that would allow residents of Manor End, holiday makers using their holiday homes and the visitors to the Manor End car park free access along that stretch of road is frankly unreasonable.

If the local authority is intending to continue promoting use of the Manor End car park to visitors of the Landguard facilities it is essential the the access situation through these streets is improved.

I hope the committee will support the proposals and we will see improved access to the area.
