Thank you for your message. I would advise you that Aldeburgh Town Council has been formally consulted on these proposals.

Your concerns about the proposals for Aldeburgh have been noted will in due course be included in any report made to the Rights of Way Committee. This Committee considers both rights of way and traffic management proposals that are contested. The Committee's recommendations are then reported to the Portfolio Holder, Councillor Guy McGregor, for the Council's final decision on the proposals and in that case I will write to you again after the decision. Heather,

I am the owner of 15 Alde Lane, Aldeburgh and therefore affected by the scope of the proposed prohibition of waiting order.

I am very familiar with the parking issues and volume of traffic issues on Alde Lane and the surrounding roads. However, I cannot support this proposal without Suffolk County Council proposing how to accommodate all the displaced vehicles and traffic. To be absolutely clear, the grounds on which I object are that the current proposal is incomplete and does not deal fully with the problems it is attempting to resolve. I also object on the grounds that the Council has not communicated to me where I would now be able to

find alternative parking.

I have to complain in the strongest terms to Suffolk County Council as the Council has made it impossible for me to demonstrate the warm citizenship I feel for the town of Aldeburgh, my neighbours and visitors and support this Order until such time as a proposal for alternative parking is made. The residents and Council must work together to present solutions to the very real problem of so many cars and traffic and issuing this non-strategic narrow order will only make those problems worse. I am absolutely convinced that the correct approach would be to consult appropriately with the Aldeburgh Town Council and residents groups on alternative parking proposals and then present both the Prohibition of Waiting Order 201 and new parking schemes together. This may delay implementing the Prohibition of Waiting Order but it will ensure that new proposals are complete and provide a full strategically planned Aldeburgh parking scheme for residents and visitors.
