Dear Ms Miller,

I am writing to you on behalf of Aldeburgh Business Association (ABA) to express its members concerns regarding the Traffic Regulation Order Notices for The Terrace and Alde Lane in Aldeburgh.

Whilst the ABA understands the congestion and safety issues that surround these roads, it is very disappointing that no alternative parking provisions are being suggested for both residents and High Street businesses.

The parking charges in Aldeburgh have been increased recently, which has worsened the problem of congestion in all roads in Aldeburgh without parking restrictions. It seems that Suffolk County Council and Suffolk Coastal District Council are simply moving the problem from area to area within Aldeburgh rather than confronting and tackling the problem as a whole.

The ABA is trying to promote and support local businesses as well as increasing footfall to Aldeburgh. The Aldeburgh High Street businesses are under immense economic pressure and staff/owners parking problems will add to this heavy burden. We would hope that Suffolk County Council would be supporting local trade and tourism and therefore we would ask SCC to offer alternative parking provisions such as parking permits, free or deeply-discounted parking for businesses and workers, before imposing restrictions.
