Dear Heather Miller,

We write in response to your notice regarding the proposal to introduce double yellow lines along the whole of Alde Lane and in other places in Aldeburgh. The garaging and vehicle access to our house leads on to Alde Lane so we are daily users of this road. For your information we enclose a copy of a letter to Mr White in September 2011 but now wish to include this in formally writing to you now that the public consultation has begun.

With regard to the proposals for Alde Lane, your intentions have not changed since last September so we would be grateful if you would use my letter of 7th September 2011 as the basis of our comments. We would wish to emphasise that the main problem with Alde Lane has been the junction with Victoria Road, particularly with cars parked very near to this spot which makes turning into or out of either Victoria Road or Alde Lane hazardous and potentially dangerous.

The only additional point we would like to make to the September letter is to question the need to double yellow line the whole of Alde Lane. There may be good reasons for suggesting this, but our point is that the dangerous area is at the junction with Victoria Road and that double yellow lining at the junction for a couple of hundred yards would improve this problem whilst still allowing parking in the straighter part of Alde Lane. Alternately there could be double yellow lining at the Victoria Road junction and then single yellow lining for the remainder of Alde Lane.

You are probably aware that there is a mistake in your published notice, the wording of which does not tally with you plans available at the Aldeburgh Library. The notice refers to ' - the north side of Park ROAD - ' It should presumably read ' - Park LANE - ' as there is no junction between Park Road and Alde Lane or Church Walk.

Dear Mr White,

I am writing regarding the proposal for Alde Lane - reference ET045645 - 101.

Although not a residence in Alde Lane, the garaging and vehicle access to our house is via Granvilles Garden, at the South end of Alde Lane. Therefore we are regular users of Alde Lane and have been concerned for some time with the safety issues in regard to that road, particularly at its junction with Victoria Road, which has now become, because of parking in the road, a serious hazard for traffic. The whole of Alde Lane has become much more difficult to negotiate in recent years so your proposals for the 'no waiting at any time' are to be welcomed.

However, have you given some thought as to where the residents of the houses, without parking, at the North end of Alde Lane (near the junction with Victoria Road) are to park and, as one of the directors of Granvilles Garden Association, a private road, we must take steps to ensure that parking, by others, is not allowed in our entrance.

To this end it would be useful to know, if the proposals are agreed, when the 'yellow lining' is to happen, so that the Granvilles Garden Association can consider whether to extend the 'yellow lining' into our road. It would also be useful to know what the cost would be for you to extend your 'yellow lining' into the beginning of Granvilles Garden.

Thank you for taking time to consider this email and would be grateful of an acknowledgement of its receipt. I look forward to hearing from you
