However , in regards to Linton Place off Chalkstone Way I would withdraw my objection as parents are now using Linton Place as a parking area beings as a new school has now , unfortunately , been built opposite and local resident are not happy . Just also to mention that in the schedule ' Linton ' has been spelt ' Linten ' with an ' E ' .

Just also again , one of the maps indicates Queen Street in Withersfield , however that address is designated as Approach Cottages by the royal mail and the postcode aspect . Also on the same map a street is designated as Bellings Road , which is also incorrect . Believe it is map number ETO 2060 / 17

To some extent I agree with Cllr Cox but I would prefer this to be deferred until such time as the plans for the Chalkstone Middle School site are known and the impact that any development there will have on parking is able to be taken into account. I would also point out that I have had residents complain to me about people parking in front of the garages and preventing access to those garages so the situation is absolutely not cut and dried.

Good morning Councillors,

The consultation period for the draft orders came to an end on the 13th July. There are a number of objections which I will try to resolve and then ask the objector to withdraw them.

One objection is from Cllr Gordon Cox, and is below. He objects to all the Millfields Way restrictions - these are in the cul de sacs which give access to private garages. He seems to be making the point that now the school has closed the problem may have gone. The problem was perceived to be vehicles parking in the cul de sac and obstructing access to the garages. Yellow lines would help prevent this.

In view of what Cllr Cox says, is it your view that the situation has improved and therefore lines not required. I would prefer to leave as proposed, but would welcome your comments. As it stands, Cllr Cox's objection will be reported to Rights of Way Cttee in Sept (along with any others that have been lodged and not withdrawn) and it'll be for the cttee to decide whether to change the proposals.
