

**SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, BURY ST EDMUNDS)
(PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING, LOADING BAY,
PERMIT PARKING ZONE 'L' AND REVOCATION) ORDER 201-**

Suffolk County Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1(1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3), 4(2), 32, 35, 45, 46, 49 and 53 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as 'the Act of 1984') and of all other enabling powers, after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order:

PART 1: INTERPRETATION

1. (1) In this Order:

'driver' in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in a parking place;

'owner' in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such a vehicle is kept and used;

'parking place' means any part of the road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place;

'parking enforcement officer' means a person employed by or who has been authorised by St Edmundsbury Borough Council ('the Borough Council') to carry out enforcement duties in relation to the provisions of this order;

'permit parking zone' means the lengths of road described in Schedule 2 that contain permit parking places and designated Zone 'L';

'resident' means a person whose usual place of abode is in any road specified in Schedule 2;

'parking permit' means a permit issued by the Borough Council in accordance with the provisions of Articles 25 (1) (a) and 27;

'permit-holder' means a person to whom a permit has so been issued;

'visitor parking voucher' means a voucher issued under the provisions of Articles 25(1) (b) and 27;

'visitor parking permit' means a permit issued under the provisions of Article 25 (1) (c) and 27;

'social health care permit disc' means a valid permit disc issued by St Edmundsbury Borough Council to a health or social care professional or volunteer for the purpose of visiting residents in their homes in order to provide such residents with a health or social care service; such disc capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting has begun;

'business permit' means a valid permit issued by the Borough Council for a business to use a residents' parking place;

a 'business' means a business that relies upon on-street parking for use by its customers in order to operate;

'school staff permit' means a valid permit issued by St Edmundsbury Borough Council to a school located in a residents' parking zone for the staff of that school to use a permit parking place on days and times specified on the permit;

'registered medical practitioner' means a medical practitioner holding a license to practise under and within the meaning of the Medical Act 1983;

'senior citizen' means a person over 60 years of age;

'qualifying premises' means any premises in the permit parking zone that is a residential premises, church premises or voluntary organisation premises, has its own postal address in that zone, and that:

- (a) existed as such on * 2014 (*operative date of made order*); or
- (b) qualifies, at the discretion of the Borough Council, following any change of use, conversion into flats or construction of new buildings;

'qualifying vehicle' means a goods vehicle, invalid carriage, motor cycle or passenger vehicle;

'goods vehicle' has the same meaning as in Section 138(3) of the Act of 1984;

'light goods vehicles' means a goods vehicle with an operating weight (as defined in Section 138(2) of the Act of 1984) not exceeding 3.5 tonnes;

'passenger vehicle' means a motor vehicle other than a motor cycle, invalid carriage or vehicle drawing a trailer or caravan, constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than 12 passengers (excluding the driver of the vehicle) and their effects;

'security vehicle' means a vehicle specifically adapted and used for the delivery and collection of cash and valuables and driven by an employee of a recognised security firm;

'motor cycle' has the same meaning as in Section 136(4) of the Act of 1984;

'ticket machine' means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State for the purpose of this Order being apparatus designed to indicate the time by a clock and to issue parking tickets;

'parking ticket' means a numbered ticket issued by a ticket machine relevant to that area indicating the payment of a charge, the period in respect of which it has been paid and the day and time at which the charge was paid;

'charging period' means a period during which the driver of a vehicle left in a parking place must make the appropriate payment in accordance with the provisions of this Order;

'disabled person's vehicle' has the same meaning as in Section 142 of the Act of 1984;

'disabled person's badge' has the same meaning as in Regulation 2(1) of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (England) Regulations 2000;

'parking disc' means a device that:

- (a) is 125 millimetres square and coloured blue
- (b) has been issued by a local authority and has not ceased to be valid;
- (c) is capable of showing the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting has begun;

(2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying:

(a) a disabled person's badge or a parking permit in the relevant position when:

- (i) the badge or permit is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle; or
- (ii) where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia, the badge or permit is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle;

so that the front of the badge or permit is clearly legible from outside of the vehicle;

(b) a parking disc in the relevant position when:

- (i) the disc is exhibited on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle; or
- (ii) where the vehicle is not so fitted with a dashboard or fascia, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle;

so that, when marked to show the quarter-hour period during which a period of waiting began, that period is clearly legible from outside the vehicle.

(3) Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

2. The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption to the provisions of this Order are without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.

PART 2: WAITING RESTRICTIONS

Prohibition of Waiting

3. Except as provided in Article 4 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the sides of road specified under Type 1 in Schedule 1.

4. (1) Nothing in Article 3 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle;

- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said sides of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

- (2) Nothing in Article 3 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the sides of road referred to in that Article for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same side of road on the same day).

Limited Waiting

- 5. Except as provided in Article 6, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday on the sides of road specified under Type 170 in Schedule 1;
 - (a) for a period of longer than 1 hour; or
 - (b) if a period of less than 3 hours have elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same side of the road.
- 6. (1) Nothing in Article 5 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of road referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable:
 - (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (b) goods to be loaded or unloaded from the vehicle
 - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said side of road; or
 - (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
 - (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

- (2) Nothing in Article 5 shall make it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle, which displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge, to wait at any time on the side of road referred to therein.

PART 3: AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

7. (1) The parts of road specified in Column 1 of Schedules 3, 4, 5 and 6 are authorised, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as parking places for such classes of vehicles, in such position and on such days and during such hours as are specified in the said Schedules.
- (2) The use of the parts of road described in the said Column 1 of Schedules 3, 4 5 and 6 as parking places shall be limited to those parts of the said roads bounded on one side by the kerb and on the other sides by a broken white line.
8. (1) Except as provided in Articles 21, 22 and 23, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait;
- (a) between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday in the parking places specified in Column 1 of Schedule 3; or
- (b) in the parking place specified in Column 1 of Schedule 4:
- (i) between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday for a period of longer than 1 hour; or
- (ii) if a period of less than 3 hours have elapsed since the termination during the said hours of the last period of waiting (if any) by that vehicle on the same side of the road;
- unless the vehicle displays in the relevant position a parking permit, a visitor permit, a social health care permit disc, a business permit, a school staff permit or a visitor parking voucher.
9. Except as provided in Article 23, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place specified in Column 1 of Schedule 5 unless the vehicle is being used for the purposes of, and only for so long as is necessary for, the loading or unloading of goods.
10. Except as provided in Articles 21 and 23, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking place specified in Column 1 of Schedule 6 between the hours of 10.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday except under the pay and display charging provisions set out in Article 38.
11. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in the parking places specified in Column 1 of Schedules 3, 4, 5 and 6 in a position other than that specified.
12. A driver of a vehicle shall not use the parking places specified in Column 1 of Schedules 3, 4, 5 and 6:
- (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance; or
- (b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed the

parking place and exhibited a notice of such closing on or near the parking place.

13. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or depart from the parking place.
14. The driver of a vehicle shall ensure, as far as is practicable, that the forward most part of the vehicle is facing in the same direction as the flow of traffic on the carriageway on which the vehicle waits.
15. No person shall use a vehicle, while its is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire his or her skill or services.
16. No person shall use any part of a parking place or any vehicle left in a parking place for sleeping, camping or cooking.
17. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of the provisions contained in Articles 8, 9, 10 and 11 a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from the parking place: provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of Article 11, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.
18. For the purpose of meeting the requirements of an emergency, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a police constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or removes or arranges for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place.
19. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Article 17 or 18 may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as they think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as they think necessary to enable them to remove it or alter its position, as the case may be.
20. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 17 or 18 they shall make arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.

Exemptions to Parking Place Restrictions

21. Nothing in Articles 8 and 10 shall make it unlawful to permit a vehicle to wait in the parking places specified in Column 1 of Schedules 3, 4 and 6 if the vehicle is a disabled' person's vehicle that displays in the relevant position a disabled person's badge and a parking disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) (not being a vehicle displaying a residents' parking permit); provided that the waiting period does not exceed three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same road or part of road on the same day);
22. (1) Nothing in Article 8 shall make it unlawful to permit a vehicle to wait in the parking places specified in Column 1 of Schedules 3 and 4 if the vehicle:

- (a) is being used by a registered medical practitioner, nurse or midwife for the purpose of visiting a patient in their home to provide a health service, and which displays a form of identification indicating of the nature of the visit;
 - (b) displays a valid social health care permit disc; or
 - (c) displays a valid School Staff permit on any day other than a Saturday or Sunday during the school term, when the pupils of the school for which the permit has been issued are in attendance, or when the staff of that school are required to attend.
- (2) Nothing in Article 10 shall make it unlawful to permit a vehicle to wait in the parking place specified in Column 1 of Schedule 6 if the vehicle:
- (a) is waiting for only as long as is necessary in connection with posting or removing advertising material in the form of posters, or cleaning windows or chimneys, at premises adjacent to the parking place;
 - (b) is waiting only for as long as is necessary to load or unload goods from the vehicle; provided that if the vehicle is:
 - (i) a security vehicle delivering or collecting or delivering cash or other valuables to or from a bank or building society; or
 - (ii) a goods vehicle

except upon the authorisation of a police officer in uniform, a traffic warden, a parking enforcement officer or a Police Community Support Officer, the vehicle does not wait for a period of longer than 15 minutes.

23. Nothing in Articles 8, 9 and 10 shall make it unlawful to permit a vehicle to wait in the parking places specified in Column 1 of Schedules 3, 4, 5 and 6 if the vehicle:
- (1) is waiting only for as long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
 - (2) is waiting only for as long as is necessary to load or unload goods from the vehicle; subject, in the case of any goods vehicle or security vehicle waiting in the parking place specified in Schedule 5, to the provisions of Article 22 (2);
 - (3) if the vehicle is being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets, as defined in Section 125 of the Postal Services Act 2000, to or from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place;
 - (4) is waiting on the direction of or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, a traffic warden, a parking enforcement officer or a Police Community Support Officer;
 - (5) is waiting only for as long as is necessary to avoid an accident or an obstruction to the free movement of traffic;
 - (6) is waiting because the driver is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control;
 - (7) is being used in the course of police, fire, ambulance or paramedic operations;

- (8) is being used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:
- (a) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road; or
 - (d) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said side of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications system as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;
- (9) is being used in the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
- (10) cannot be conveniently be used for the following purposes without contravening the provisions of this Order:
- (a) making deliveries of or collections of articles in the course of a trade or business;
 - (b) in connection with a wedding or funeral;
 - (c) the removal of furniture from or delivery of furniture to premises;
- provided that in each of the purposes specified above, the vehicle waits only for so long as is necessary to achieve the relevant purpose.

Suspension of Parking Places

24. A police officer in uniform, a traffic warden, a parking enforcement officer, a Police Community Support Officer; or any person duly authorised by the County Council or Borough Council, may suspend the use of any permit parking place or part thereof if they consider it reasonably necessary:
- (1) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (2) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place; the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking place; or the laying, erection, alteration, removal or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or of any telegraphic line, traffic sign or traffic machine;
 - (3) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place or on any occasion when furniture is being removed from such premises; or
 - (4) on any occasion when it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed.

Permit Parking Places

Issue of Parking Permits and Associated Charges

25. (1) Any resident of a qualifying premises in any length of road specified in Schedule 2 may, under the provisions of Article 27, apply to the Borough Council for the issue

of the following permits or vouchers to use a parking place for a qualifying vehicle in Permit Parking Zone 'L':

- (a) up to two parking permits per postal address;
- (b) a book of visitor parking vouchers per postal address, for use by bona fide visitors to that address, up to a maximum of 50 vouchers per calendar year; and
- (c) in the case of a property in which no occupant owns, leases, hire purchases or keeps and uses a motor vehicle, but in which resides a senior citizen, one visitor parking permit per postal address for use by bona fide visitors to that property;

such postal address to be specified in the application.

- (2) The owner or manager of any business located in any road specified in Schedule 2 who can show the business relies upon available on-street parking for use by its customers in order to operate the business may apply to the Borough Council for the issue of up to four business parking permits for use by its customers.
 - (3) A resident of a length of road specified in Schedule 2 who is eligible for a parking permit, visitor parking voucher or visitor parking permit may use any parking place contained in those parts of road that are within Permit Parking Zone 'L' and described more particularly in Column 1 of Schedules 3 and 4.
 - (4) Applications for parking permits, business permits, social health care permit discs, school staff permits and visitor parking vouchers must be made in writing on a form prescribed by the Borough Council, include the particular information and authentication required and be accompanied by the appropriate charge (if any) specified in Columns 1-4 of Schedule 6.
 - (5) The Borough Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit, or a visitor's parking voucher, or a permit-holder, to produce to an officer of that Council such evidence in respect of the application made to it as it may reasonably call for to verify any particulars or information given to it or in respect of any permit or voucher issued by it as it may reasonably call to verify that the permit or voucher is valid.
 - (6) Upon receipt of an application duly made under the foregoing provisions of this Article, and upon receipt of the charge specified therein, the Borough Council may issue up to two permits for the resident, or anyone living in the same household as the resident, or a book of visitor parking vouchers for use by bona fide visitors, to leave a qualifying vehicle in the parking places contained in Parking Zone 'L' for which the resident is eligible, as specified in paragraph (1) of this Article.
26. All charges associated with permits, visitor parking vouchers and the use of permit parking places shall be for the time being as specified in Schedule 7, but notwithstanding references to such charges in this Order, they may be revised from time to time at the discretion of the Borough Council.
27. The following provisions will apply to the issue of the permits and visitor parking vouchers specified in Article 25:
- (1) up to two residents' permits and up to 50 visitor parking vouchers per calendar year only may be issued for each qualifying premises;

- (2) a permit or book of visitor parking vouchers may be issued to a resident of premises in a road specified in Schedule 2 to use the parking places in Parking Zone 'L' specified in Article 25 (1) only;
- (3) one visitor parking permit only may be issued for a property specified in Article 25 (c), provided that the said property appears in the Borough Council's council tax valuation list within Zone 'M'; and
- (4) a permit shall be for a fixed period.

Form and Validity of Permits

28. (1) A parking permit shall be in a form prescribed by the Borough Council and shall include the following particulars:
- (a) the parking zone in respect of which the permit has been issued;
 - (b) the date of issue and the period during which the permit shall remain valid;
 - (c) a serial number or reference letters by which the permit may be identified;
 - (d) an indication that it has been issued by the Borough Council;
- and any additional particulars that the Borough Council may from time to time determine.
- (2) A visitor parking voucher shall be in a form prescribed by the Borough Council and shall include the following particulars:
- (a) a serial number by which the voucher may be identified;
 - (b) the date on which the voucher will be valid
 - (c) the relevant day, month and year on which the voucher is displayed, to be indicated by the resident or by their bona fide visitor in accordance with the instructions on the voucher.
29. A parking permit or visitor parking voucher shall cease to be valid at the expiration of the date shown on the permit or voucher, or on the date of surrender or revocation of the permit in accordance with the provisions of this Order, whichever date is the earlier.
30. Where an applicant for a parking permit or book of visitor parking vouchers pays for the permit or vouchers charge by cheque and the cheque is subsequently dishonoured, the parking permit or voucher shall be deemed to have been of no effect as from the date of issue.

Surrender and Withdrawal of Permits

31. (1) A permit-holder may at any time surrender their permit to the Borough Council and shall, on surrendering the permit, be entitled, subject to an administrative charge at the discretion of the Borough Council, to a refund of one quarter part of the permit charge specified in Schedule 6 in respect of each complete 3 month period in which the permit would have remained valid had it not been surrendered; always provided that the relevant parking place has not been altered or suspended by Order or by physical changes to the respective road.

- (2) A permit-holder shall surrender a permit to the Council if they cease to reside at the premises in respect of which the permit was issued and on the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (2) of Article 32.
 - (3) A surrendered permit shall cease to be valid from the date of its surrender.
32. (1) The Borough Council may, by notice in writing to the permit-holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit, or at any other address believed to be that person's place of abode, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Borough Council that any of the events set out in paragraph (2) of this Article have occurred and the permit-holder shall surrender the permit to the Borough Council, without entitlement to refund of any part of the permit charge.
- (2) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:
 - (a) the issue of a revised permit or duplicate permit by the Borough Council under the provisions of Article 33;
 - (b) the permit ceasing to be valid on the expiry of the period stated;
 - (c) in cases of misuse of the permit, at the discretion of the Borough Council.
33. (1) If a permit is mutilated or accidentally defaced or the figures or particulars thereon have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit-holder may apply to the Borough Council for the issue to them of a duplicate permit and the Borough Council, upon the receipt of the application, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the original permit shall become invalid.
- (2) If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Borough Council for the issue to them of a duplicate permit and the Borough Council, upon being satisfied as to such loss or destruction, shall issue a duplicate permit so marked and upon such issue the original permit shall become invalid.
 - (3) A charge shall be made, as specified in Column 5 of Schedule 6, to the permit holder for the issue of a duplicate permit for any of the reasons referred to in the foregoing paragraphs of this Article.
 - (4) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a revised permit or a duplicate permit and an application for such a permit as if it were a permit or, as the case may be, an application for a permit.

Notice and Payment of Excess Charge

34. Where a vehicle is left in a parking place for any period between the hours specified in Article 8 in relation to that parking place, without a valid permit or visitor parking voucher displayed in accordance with the provisions of this Order, not being a vehicle subject to the exemptions specified in Article 20, the driver shall incur an excess charge specified in Column 6 of Schedule 6 payable to the Borough Council within 28 days; provided that if the excess charge is paid within 14 days, a reduced excess charge as described in Column 7 of that Schedule shall be payable.
35. Where an excess charge has been incurred the parking enforcement officer shall complete a notice and attach it in a conspicuous position to the vehicle and any such notice shall include the following particulars:

- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle, or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
 - (b) the time at which the parking enforcement officer first noticed the excess charge had been incurred, the time at which the excess charge notice was issued and the location at which the excess charge was incurred;
 - (c) a statement that the excess charge specified in Column 6 of Schedule 6 is required to be paid within 28 days but if the payment is made within 14 days a reduced excess charge as specified in Column 7 of that Schedule is required to be paid, and the manner in which the excess charge should be paid; and
 - (d) a statement of the alleged contravention and that it is an offence under Section 47 of the Act of 1984 for the driver of a vehicle left in a parking place to fail to pay the excess charge.
36. Where an excess charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 35, no person other than a parking enforcement officer or other person authorised by the Borough Council shall remove the notice from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place.
37. (1) Any charge payable to the Borough Council under Article 34 shall be paid by a method specified on the excess charge notice.
- (2) Payment by cheque or postal order, made payable to St Edmundsbury Borough Council and addressed to the Head of Legal and Democratic Services, St Edmundsbury Borough Council, West Suffolk House, Western Way, Bury St Edmunds, Suffolk, IP33 3YU shall be delivered or sent by post to be received by the Borough Council not later than 1.00 p.m. on the 28th day following the day on which the excess charge was incurred (or on the 14th day in the event of a reduced excess charge); provided that if the said 28th day or 14th day falls on a day on which the offices of the District Council are closed, the period within which payment of the said excess charges should be made shall be extended to 1.00 p.m. on the next full day on which the offices are open.

Pay and Display Parking Place

Payment of Initial Charge and Display of Tickets

38. (1) The driver of any vehicle parked in the parking place specified in Column 1 of Schedule 6 shall, on leaving the vehicle in the parking place, pay the appropriate charge set out in Column 6 of that Schedule.
- (2) The charge shall be payable by the insertion of an appropriate coin or coins, or other specified method of payment, in a ticket machine, and the driver shall exhibit on the vehicle, in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (3), (4) and (5) of this Article, a ticket issued by a ticket machine; or, where available, payment may be made or authorised from a mobile phone or computer or by means of vehicle recognition software.
- (3) The driver of a vehicle shall attach a ticket referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article in a conspicuous position on the vehicle in respect of which it was issued and shall cause the said ticket to remain in that position at all times while the vehicle is parked in the parking place.

- (4) A ticket referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article shall be exhibited on the vehicle:
- (a) where the vehicle is fitted with a front glass windscreen extending across the vehicle to the near side, facing forwards on the near side of the glass of the windscreen, behind the glass; and
 - (b) where the vehicle is not fitted with such a front glass windscreen, on the near side of the vehicle facing towards the near side, and not less than 2 feet six inches (0.75 metres) and not more than six feet six inches (1.95 metres) above the surface of the parking place on which the vehicle is standing;
- being clearly visible to a person standing at the near side of the vehicle.
- (5) When a parking ticket has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions in paragraph (4) of this Article, no person shall remove the parking ticket from the vehicle until that vehicle is removed from the parking place.

Notice and Payment of Excess Charge

39. (1) If a vehicle is left in the parking place during the charging period without the initial charge having been paid or for a longer period of parking thereby permitted, an excess charge as specified in Column 7 of Schedule 6 ('the excess charge') shall be payable within 28 days; provided that, if the excess charge is paid within 14 days, a reduced excess charge as specified in Column 8 of that Schedule, shall be payable.
- (2) Where an excess charge has been incurred the parking enforcement officer shall complete a notice and attach it in a conspicuous position to the vehicle and any such notice shall include the following particulars:
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle, or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
 - (b) the make and colour of the vehicle;
 - (c) the time at which the parking enforcement officer first noticed the excess charge had been incurred, the time at which the excess charge notice was issued and the location at which the excess charge was incurred;
 - (d) in the case of a vehicle that has been left for longer than the period of parking permitted by the initial charge that has been paid, the time at which the parking ticket expired;
 - (e) a statement that the excess charge specified in Column 7 of Schedule 6 is required to be paid within 28 days but if the payment is made within 14 days a reduced excess charge as specified in Column 8 of that Schedule is required to be paid, and the manner in which the excess charge should be paid; and
 - (f) a statement of the alleged contravention and that it is an offence under Section 47 of the Act of 1984 for the driver of a vehicle left in a parking place to fail to pay the excess charge.
40. Where an excess charge notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 39, no person other than a parking enforcement officer or other person authorised by the Borough Council shall remove the notice from the vehicle until the vehicle is removed from the parking place.

41. The period for which a vehicle may be left in the parking place during the charging period after the excess charge has been incurred shall not exceed 2 hours.
42. No person shall insert in a ticket machine any coin additional to those inserted by way of payment of the initial charge in respect of any vehicle left in the parking place.
43. (1) Any charge payable to the Borough Council under Article 39 shall be paid by a method specified on the excess charge notice.
(2) Payment of an excess charge by cheque or postal order shall be made under the provisions specified in Article 37 (2).

Additional Exemptions from Charges

44. (1) In addition to the provisions of Article 23, if, at any time a vehicle is left during the charging period in the parking place, there is, on the nearest ticket machine to that bay a notice placed by any person duly authorised by the Borough Council indicating that the said ticket machine is out of order, then a ticket shall be obtained from another machine, and if at that time all ticket machines bear such a notice, that vehicle shall be exempt from the initial charge, provided that the vehicle is removed within 2 hours of the ticket machines being rectified..
(2) If a vehicle referred to in paragraph (1) of this Article is not removed within the said 2-hour period, the initial charge shall be considered as having been incurred and paid at the time the vehicle was left in the parking place and all the provisions of this Order shall apply accordingly.

PART 4: REVOCATIONS AND CITATION

45. The provisions of the Suffolk County Council (Various Roads, Bury St Edmunds) (Consolidation) Order 1978, insofar as they relate to the waiting restrictions specified in Schedule 8, are hereby revoked.
46. The provisions of the Suffolk County Council (Various Roads, Bury St Edmunds) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982, insofar as they relate to the waiting restrictions specified in Schedule 8, are hereby revoked.
47. The provisions of the Borough of St Edmundsbury (Parish of Bury St Edmunds) (Various Roads) (Prohibition of Waiting and Revocation) Order 2000, insofar as they relate to the waiting restrictions specified in Schedule 9, are hereby revoked.
48. The provisions of the St Edmundsbury Borough Council (Parish of Bury St Edmunds) (Various Roads) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (Bus Stop Clearway) Order 2002, insofar as they relate to * specified in Schedule 10, are hereby revoked.
49. This Order may be cited as the Suffolk County Council (Various Roads, Bury St Edmunds) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading Bay, Permit Parking Zone 'L' and Revocation) Order 201- and shall come into operation on
