The future of Children's Centre services

Foreword

Children's centres are an essential part of delivering early support to children, young people and their families in Suffolk. We are committed to continuing to deliver high quality, effective children's centres services to families across the county. To achieve this we have to make sure that services are delivered in ways different communities want to access them and that we make the best use of buildings we have across the county.

This may mean relocating some or all of the services currently provided by your local children's centre to another venue. We believe that there are opportunities to stop using some buildings, make better use of other community buildings such as libraries and community centres and use some existing children's centres for different early years services, such as additional pre-school places, where this would help support the needs within a community.

However, as with other councils across the country we have to make significant savings over the next three years at least. The changes we are proposing will ensure that children centre services are still available across the county but also contribute to the council's overall savings total of £156million. For example, we lease some buildings in an area where there are a number of other venues where we already deliver services from, including other children's centres. It is being proposed that we stop using some of these buildings. The information included in this booklet sets out proposals for the future of children's centre services in Suffolk. However, before any decisions are taken we want to know what you think.

Since becoming the Cabinet Member in May, I have had the opportunity to visit a number of children's centres throughout the county and have seen first-hand the contributions they bring to our local communities. This consultation is an opportunity for you to let us know what services you value, and how we can improve them within the financial constraints we all face. It's about how we deliver the services you value, rather than just the buildings.

We are not proposing to make changes to every children centre. The table on page xx gives details of each children's centre and what changes, if any, are being proposed.

If the proposals in this booklet are approved changes would be made from 2015 onwards.

I would encourage you to read the information in this booklet and give your views (details on page xx) on the proposals before the twelve weeks of consultation end on 13 October 2014.

What is a children's centre?

Children's centres offer a wide range of services for families and others caring for children from age 0 to 5 years. Each children's centre is different, offering a variety of services according to the needs of local families. Activities are delivered from the children's centre itself, or through a range of outreach venues such as libraries, schools and village halls or in people's homes. All children's centres work closely with health, schools, GPs and other local service providers. Services may include:

- information and advice on childcare and early learning provision
- health services including pre and postnatal support
- parent / carer groups, including dads' and grandparent groups
- access to children's communication and early language support
- links to Jobcentre Plus and adult learning
- family support, including 1:1 work with families
- Parenting programmes

There are currently 47 children's centres in Suffolk.

Who are we consulting?

We are asking a wide range of people for their views on the proposals set out in this booklet. Copies of this booklet have been made available to parents, children's centre staff, councillors, members of Advisory Boards, and other professionals and volunteers who work with and in our children's centres.

It is important that we have a wide range of views before taking proposals back to Suffolk County Council's Cabinet in December 2014.

What are the key dates?

21 July – 13 October 2014: Public consultation

9 December 2014: Cabinet

April 2015: If approved, changes would begin to be implemented

What information have we used to inform these proposals?

A range of information has been used which includes:

- Local knowledge and statistical data which has told us how children's centres are currently accessed and used
- An analysis of children's and families' needs, informing decisions on which services are needed to support families with children aged pre-birth to 11 years living within Suffolk, including the most vulnerable families
- Equality Impact Analyses

What do we know already?

- Some children's centres are used more than others
- Many families who use centres use more than one
- Many families access a range of universal services (available to everybody) as well as targeted services (specialist support)

Staffing

This booklet does not make reference to future staffing levels at children's centres. A separate review of staffing across a wide range of Suffolk County Council's children services, including children's centres is already underway. The review will consider staffing roles and levels in children's centres with formal consultation with staff expected to take place in the autumn.

How we are proposing to deliver services from April 2015?

The table below sets out the proposal for each of the children centres across Suffolk. Changes are not currently being proposed for all centres.

	Costs relating to the current Meredith Children's Centre are around £30,000 per year. Therefore with a number of other children's centres in the area (Highfield, Bramford Lane and Wellington Children's Centres) it is proposed that the current building is no longer used as a children's centre.
	Families would only need to travel a minimum of a third of a mile and a maximum distance of a mile to access another centre. Many families who use Meredith already use other local children's centres.
	Outreach venues in the area would be used so more services can be delivered across a wider area, including rural areas where there is currently no delivery.
