

Appendix B6 – Reydon and Southwold Centre Profile (Reydon)

Summary

The current centre is only able to offer limited facilities and services for families. It has been estimated that in excess of £60,000 of works would be required over the next five years to ensure the building remained 'fit for purpose'. In addition, Kessingland families do not access Reydon. The proposal for this centre would see an increased use of outreach services in the Reydon / Kessingland areas using venues such as Marram Green, the Reydon Primary School, Reydon Village Hall and the new Health Centre in Reydon. Staff will be based at Dragonflies & Butterflies Children's Centres and will deliver valuable services to families in their own homes.

The current Children's Centre is "tucked away". In the proposed model, access to information and services will have a more visible community presence. We are also exploring the use of Sole Bay Health Centre. The Centres would also offer targeted support and outreach by Family Support Practitioners. Closer working with schools is envisaged to be able to offer targeted parenting and educational work.

The reach area will be improved by offering split venues. There is a Traveller's site at Kessingland and this proposal would increase the opportunity for those families to engage with Children's Centre services. The proposed venues also offer improved parking, It is anticipated that levels of attendance for universal and targeted services will improve footfall.

There will be projected savings of £27,472 with no recurring costs but a possible loss of revenue of £9000 from Day Nursery Provision, resulting in a net saving of £18,472.

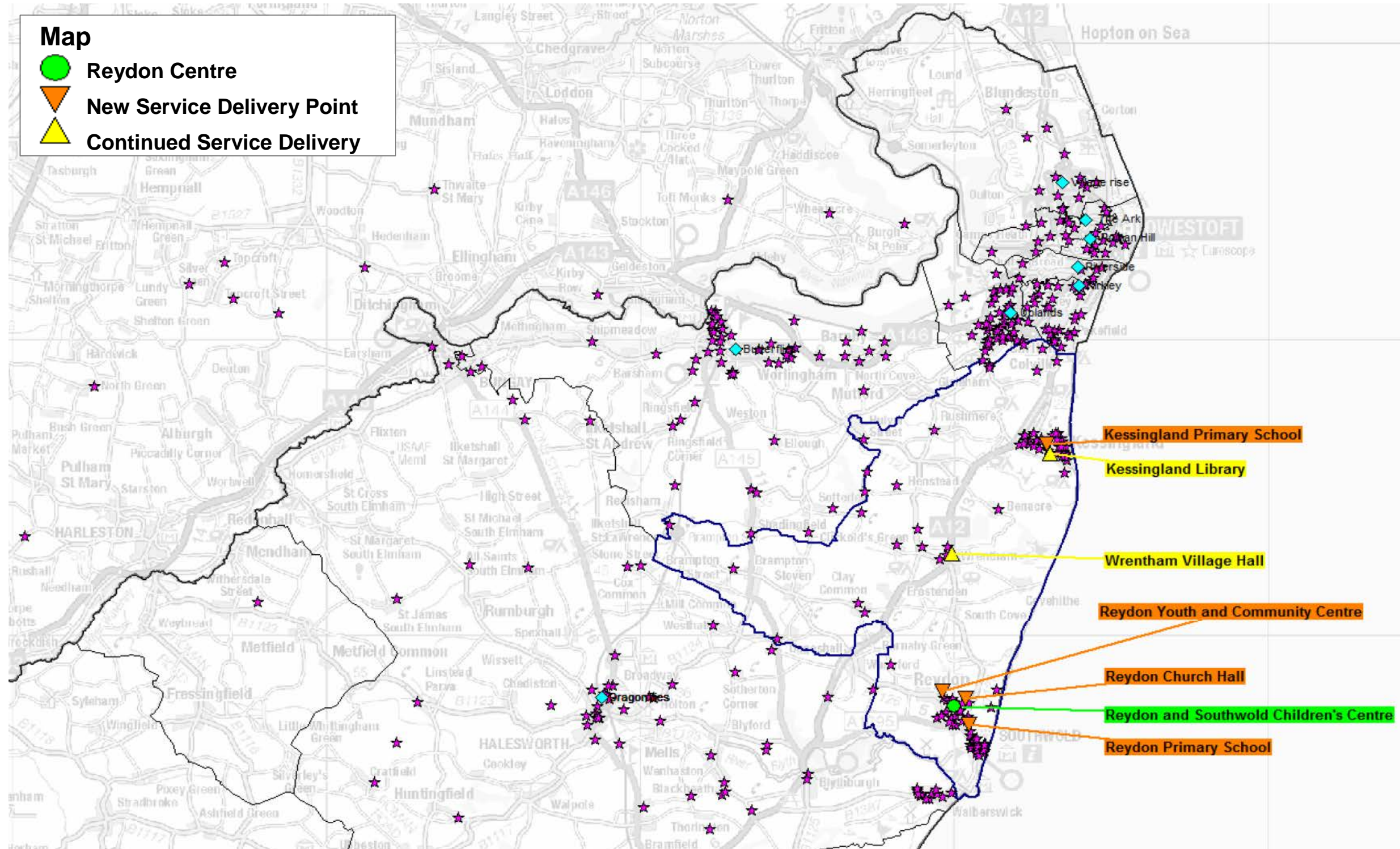

Map

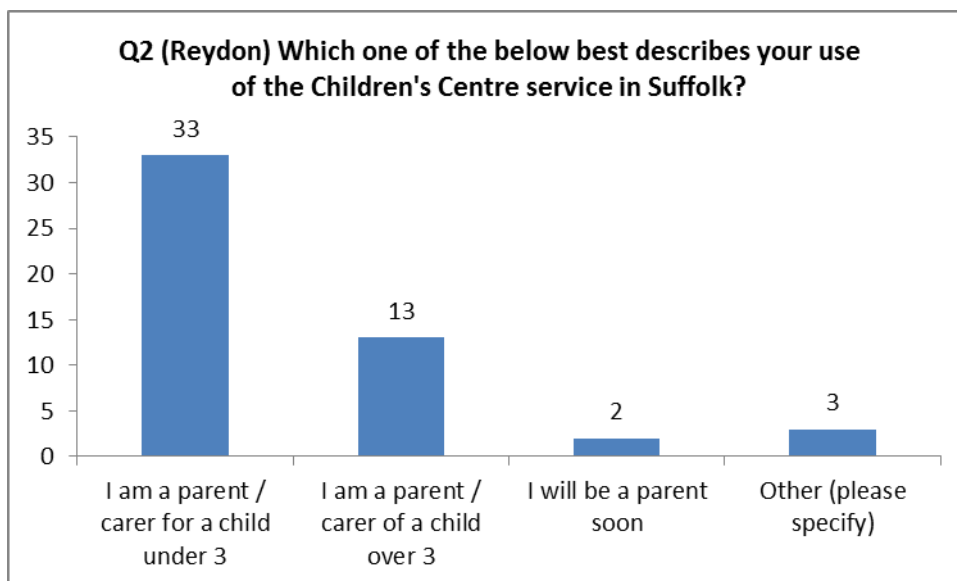
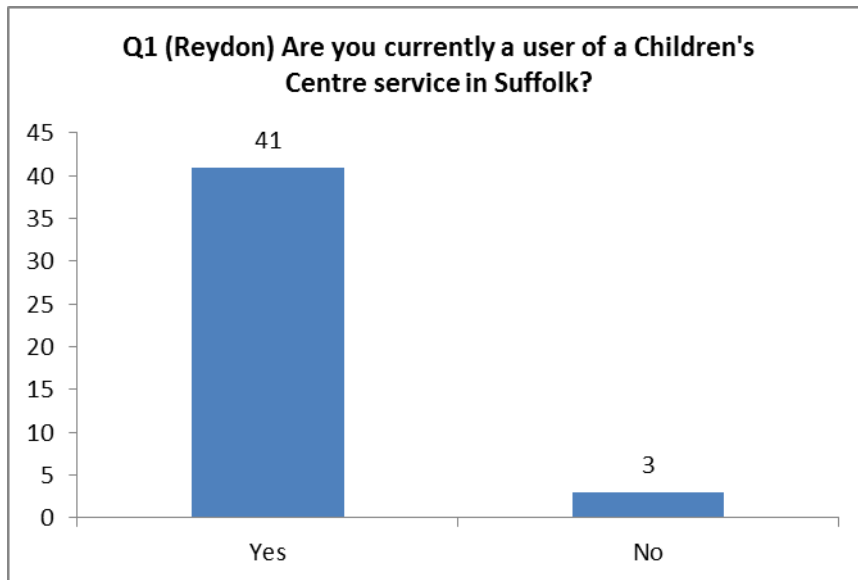
The map below shows current and proposed venues together with the distribution of registered users based on their postcode.

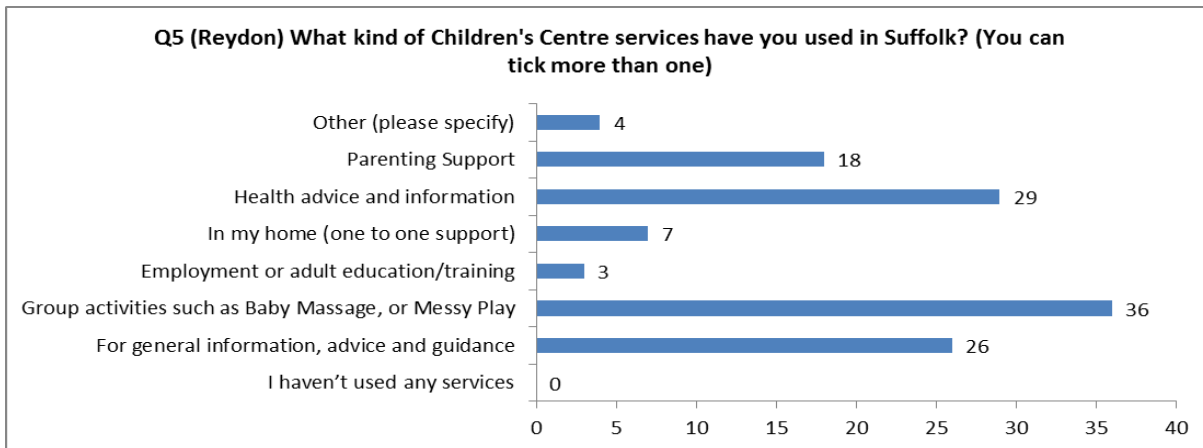
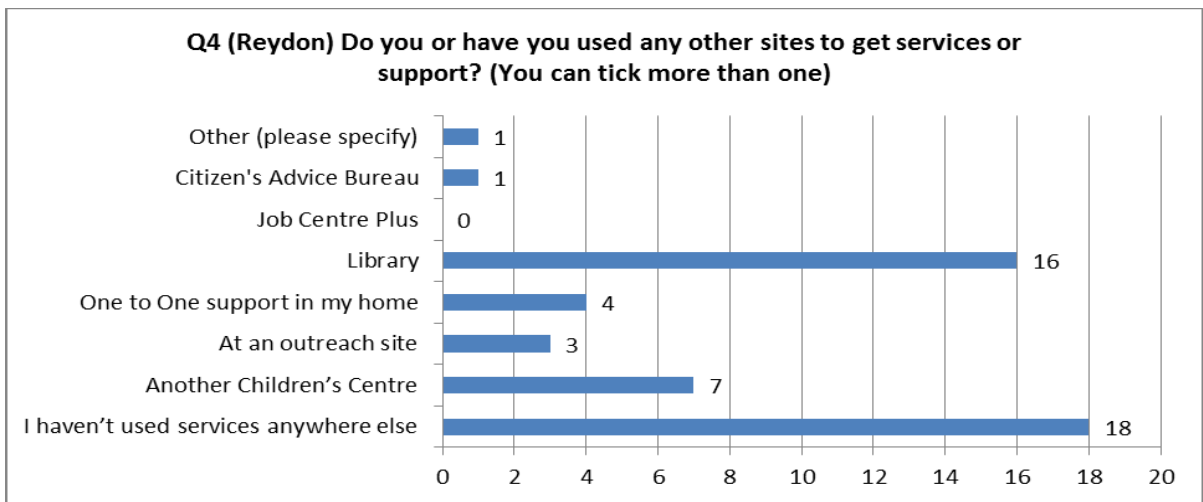
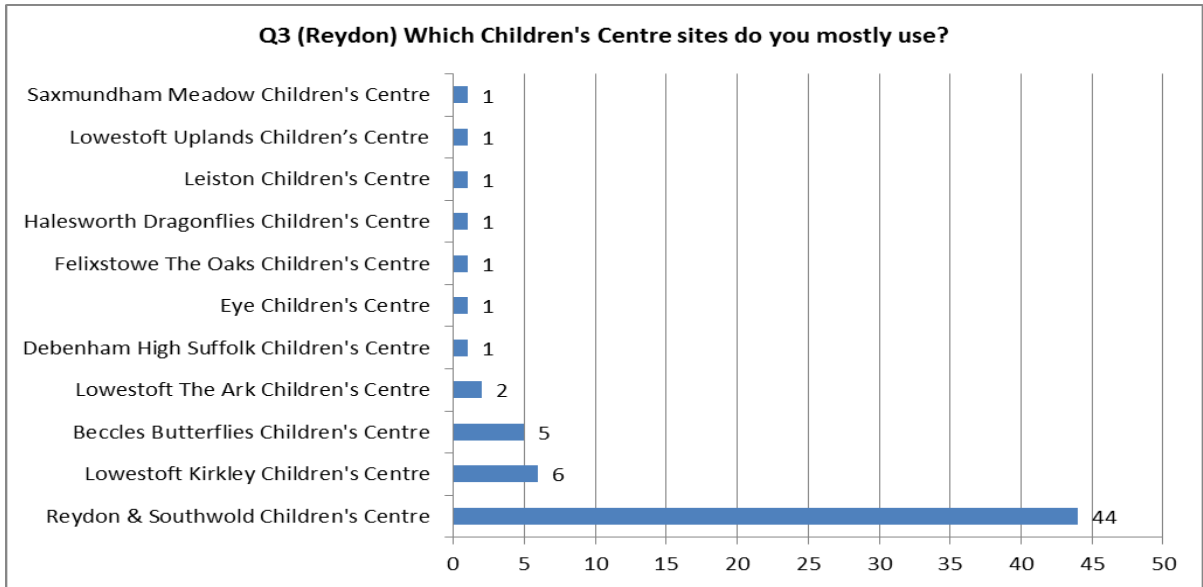

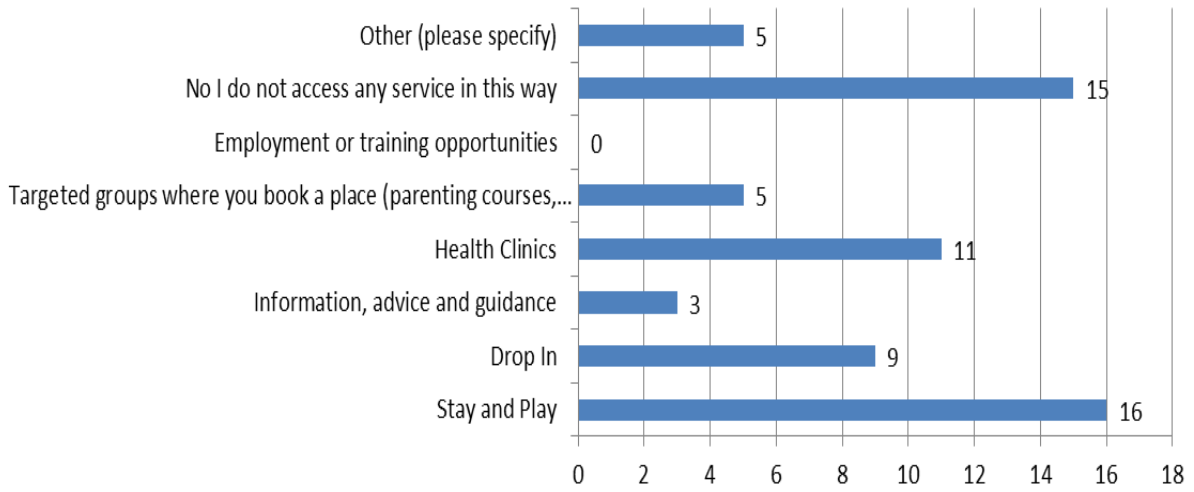

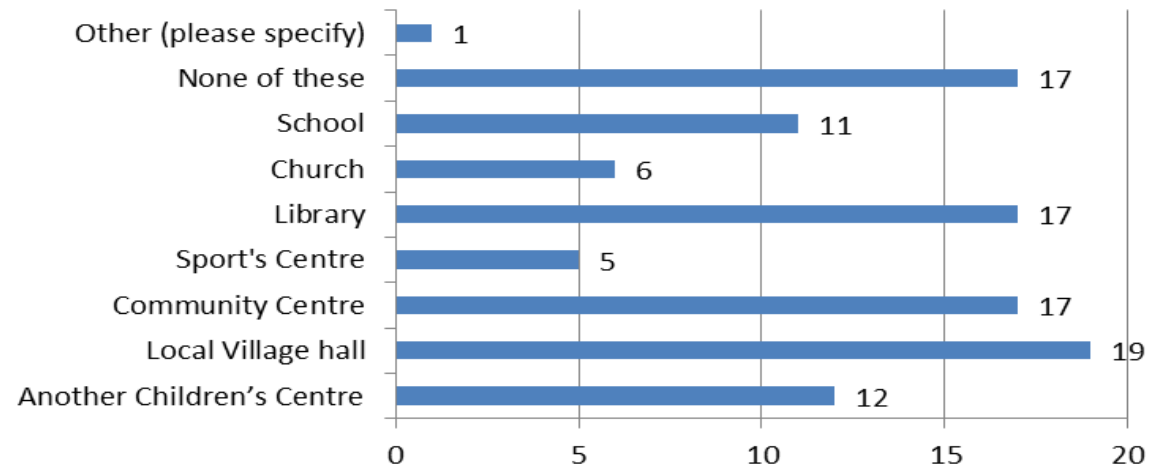




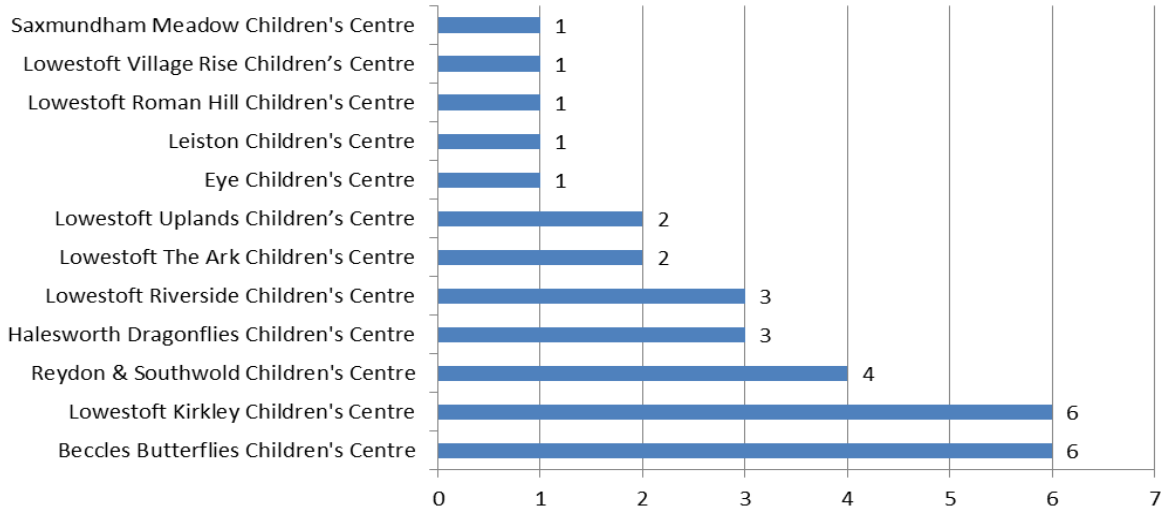
Q6 (Reydon) Do you currently go to any service delivered by the Children's Centre but from a different venue?



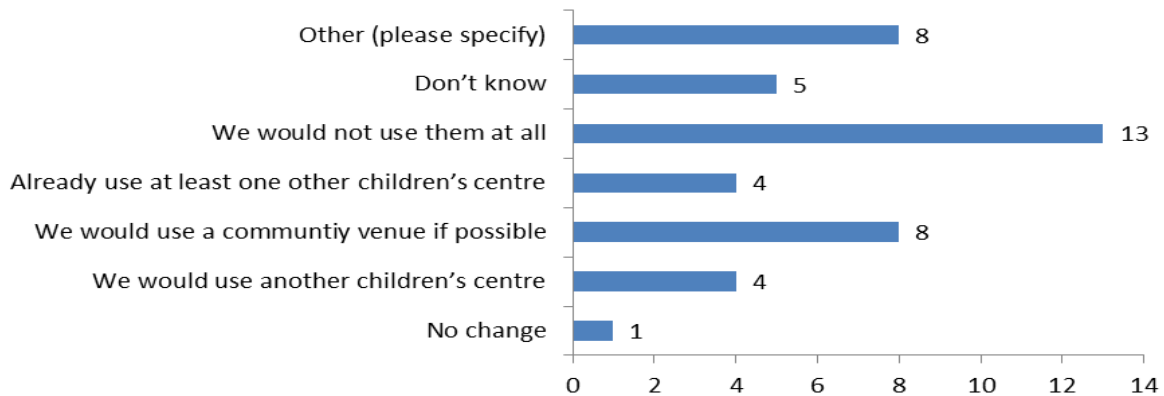
Q7 (Reydon) Would you be willing to get Children's Centre services from any of the following locations?



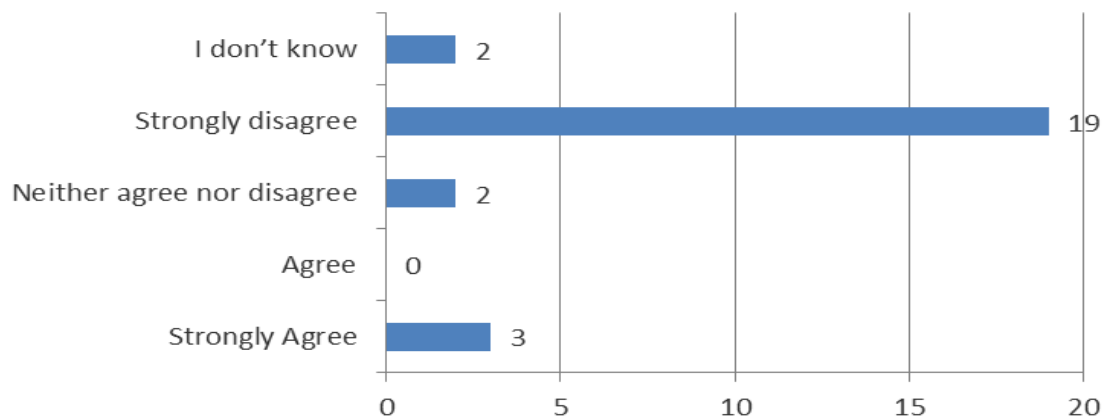
Q8 (Reydon) You answered the previous question by saying you would use another Children's Centre. Can you please tell us which you would use? (You can tick more than one)

Q10 (Brett River) To what extent do you agree or disagree with Suffolk County Council's overall proposals for changes to the Children's Centre provision in Suffolk?



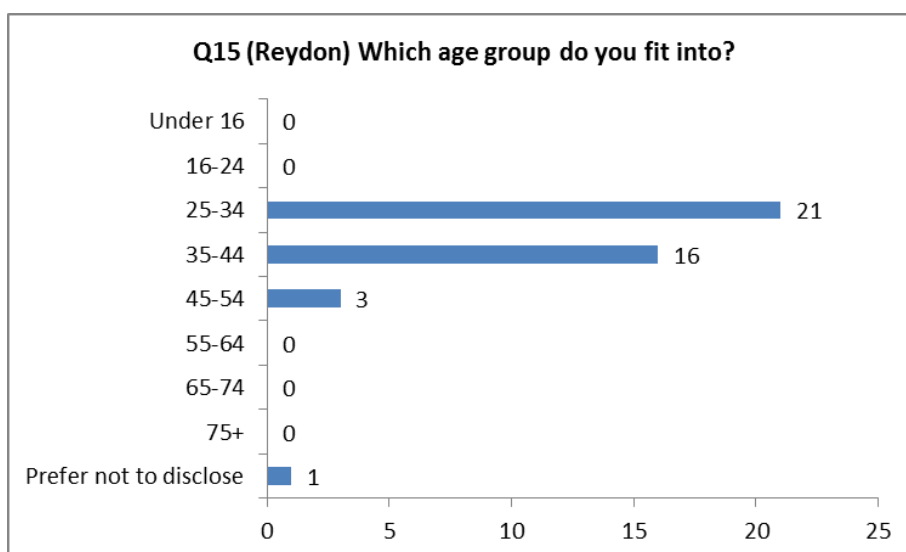

NB A Lower Layer Super Output Area (LSOA) is a geographic area. Lower Layer Super Output Areas are a geographic hierarchy designed to improve the reporting of small area statistics in England and Wales.
