The answer is "Yes" I do still have concerns regarding the parking along the bend in Sharp Road. I did have a reply from someone who said the speed of the traffic along the bend was not sufficient to cause a problem, but this is not the case. This is also a particularly bad stretch of road in the winter months as it does not receive any direct sunshine, meaning that snow and ice can remain on the surface for long periods. Sharp Road does not receive any gritting from the council.

Hi Heather

I have just read the above restriction order in the Public Notices section of the Bury Free Press.

I would point out that the road involved is Sharp Road - not "Sharp Lane".

I would also like to mention that the restriction order has simply pushed the problem from Hardwick Lane into Sharp Road. The hospital cars are now parking along the sharp bend where the entrance restriction finishes. Cars coming out of Sharp Road now have to drive on the wrong side of the road round this bend in order to pass the parked cars and this is becoming very dangerous. It will not be long before there is a head on collision.

I would be grateful if you could advise me as to who the most appropriate person is for me to report this problem.
