Safe and Stronger Communities Group (SSCG)

1. The second meeting of the SSCG took place on 10 December 2015 at Mid Suffolk District Council and was chaired by Ian Gallin. The following partner agencies were represented:
 - District, Borough and County Councils
 - Clinical Commissioning Group
 - Public Health
 - Police
 - Youth Offending service
 - Adult safeguarding
 - Community Safety Partnership chair – Waveney
 - Apologies received from the office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, Children’s Safeguarding and East Suffolk Councils

Workstreams

2. Agreement that the data is there but we need to develop a shared understanding and narrative and a subsequent clear action plan where needed. Transformation Challenge Award funding is providing improved data and analytical resource which will support the work of the group. For each work stream the SSCG needs clarity as to where the statutory duty lies and what budgets/resources are there to support this
 - Domestic Abuse – scoping lead Sara Blake, Head of Localities and Partnerships, Public Health. Work already underway via the Domestic Abuse partnership, around response to victims, service provision and demand for refuge places.
 - Youth violence and Gangs –scoping lead Jen Meade, Youth Offending Service with support from Chief Inspector Kerry Cutler.
 - Sexual Exploitation – scoping lead Ali Spalding, Local Safeguarding Children Board Manager, Suffolk County Council. Work starting through the children and exploited children group and the Multi-Agency Safeguarding Hub and a data set is being built.
 - Cyber Crime – Scoping lead for cyber child/adult exploitation – Sara Blake. SSCG needs to understand what the priority area of work is; criminal activity such as fraud scams etc **OR** bullying, grooming, sexting linked to exploitation of children and adults. There is an E safety group as a sub group of the Local Safeguarding Children Board, already working looking at exploitation of children. Sara Blake will find resource within her team to do

initial scoping. Links will be made between the E safety group and the SSCG. Matt Rose-will link with Cyber crime unit at the Police.

Community Safety Funding

3. Three issues identified and solutions discussed and agreed:
 - Funding of Domestic Homicide Review – all partners agreed to share costs of reviews as required.
 - Funding for Ecins (a multi-agency software package) case management system – Local Authorities agreed to cover the costs until the Athena partnership platform is live (approx 18 months).
 - Hate Crime - agreement that the delivery of awareness raising and training should be stay with Suffolk County Council, on behalf of county wide partners, as opposed to being commissioned to a third party.
