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Brief summary of report

4. This report provides an update on the STP process and the emerging priorities.

Background

5. The NHS Shared Planning Guidance published in December 2015 asked every health and care system to come together to create their own ambitious local blueprint for accelerating implementation of the Five Year Forward View. STPs are place based, multi-year plans built around the needs of local populations. There are 44 STP footprints across the country with Suffolk forming part of the Suffolk and North East Essex and Norfolk footprints. The Suffolk and North East Essex footprint has formed a Joint STP Steering Group which has a comprehensive membership of system leaders from health and care commissioning and provider organisations across Suffolk and North East Essex.
